MOBILE PHONES IN SCHOOL

Following a discussion at our Governors meeting last week, we have decided to continue to allow children to bring smart phones into school for the time being.

However, from September 2024, **our policy will be changing** to only allow children in Year 5 and Year 6 to bring in mobile phones if they are walking to and from school independently.

If you are dropping off and picking up your child, this will mean that your child must not bring their mobile phone into school.

We will be updating our permissions form to reflect these changes.

We would also encourage parents/carers of current Year 4 children moving into Year 5 in September to only provide their children with a simple mobile phone that allows calls/texts to avoid any inappropriate behaviour before and/or after school.

Our expectations remain the same:

- all mobile phones must be switched off and put away in a bag or pocket as soon as entering school
 grounds (this includes waiting at the front of the school for the gates to open) at the start of the
 day
- all mobile phones must be switched off and handed into the school office throughout the school day
- all mobile phones must be switched off and put away in a bag or pocket whilst leaving the school grounds at the end of the day

If these expectations are not adhered to, then the school may make the decision to **remove** a child's **privilege** to bring their mobile phone into school on temporary basis or in extreme circumstances on a permanent basis.

The Governors will review this policy every 6 months or sooner if a serious safeguarding breach occurs.

LEARNING AT MERIDIAN

Our theme and topics for the summer terms

Our overarching theme for the summer terms is "Art, Culture, Music and Literature" and this runs through the topics children will be learning about over the coming weeks.

In **Nursery and Reception**, children will be learning about **Teddy Bears** – why they are important, teddies from the past and present, famous bears and some great Teddy bear stories, including, of course, Goldilocks and the Three Bears. A famous author will be visiting to share her stories about bears.

In **Year One and Year Two**, children will be learning about **Toys** – toys from the past and the present day. They will learn about what children long ago played with and toys from around the world too. They will be visiting Brighton Toy Museum to enhance their knowledge and understanding – which I know they will love!

In **Year Three and Year Four**, children will be learning about life in Ancient Greece, including culture, art, music and literature from this ancient civilization. The team have organised a history workshop to support and bring their learning to life!

In **Year Five and Year Six**, children will be learning about life in Africa, past and present, including the Benin Civilization, and about the legacy of art, culture, music and literature over time. We obviously can't visit Africa(!), so the team have organised a history workshop too to embed children's knowledge and understanding of African history.

At Meridian, we know that reading for pleasure is so important and we encourage children in lots of different ways to enjoy reading. Every classroom has a reading area with lots of books for children to access and children have the chance to enjoy reading in their library sessions. We visit Peacehaven Library three times a year and celebrate World Book Day in school, with competitions and book swaps. Our Assemblies

Every day we have assemblies at Meridian, which include children from Year 1 to Year 6 (and on Friday assemblies, Reception children come along too!)

On Mondays, it's my assembly to the whole school where together we learn about our whole school values, links to our PSHE themes and share stories that support everyone to get along and try their best at school.

On Tuesdays and Thursdays, children either have a singing assembly with Mr. Mole - it is lovely to hear them enjoying learning and singing a variety of songs together, including our very own Meridian song (written by Mr. Mole!) or a Brilliant School assembly where children learn about positive thinking, resilience and perseverance.

On Wednesdays, our assemblies are themed around stories around the world, including festivals and days of importance - these are led by one of our Assistant Headteachers - Mrs. Newth, Mr. Barcock or Miss. Young.

On Fridays, our assemblies are led by our Deputy Headteacher, Mr. Doody, who speaks to the children about brilliant behavior and great playtimes. It's a chance to celebrate all the wonderful things that have happened that week - a great way to end the week!
